Dr. Galura follows in the footsteps of *JoPAN* co-editors, Dr. Vallire D. Hooper and Dr. Jan Odom-Forren, who held these positions for twenty-five years. During this time, *JoPAN*'s size, scope and influence grew considerably, ultimately leading to receiving an impact factor beginning in 2011. ASPAN extends heartfelt appreciation to the co-editors for their years of dedication and expertise, which have been instrumental in making *JoPAN* the premier journal for perianesthesia nursing.
