Charging Ahead: Improving Team Communication Through the Formation of a Charge Nurse Committee

Abstract Background Information: Charge nurse committees can provide numerous benefits to a healthcare organization, enhancing both operational efficiency and patient care. In our Pre/Post department, we found that by developing a charge nurse committee, we significantly advanced our department by improving patient care, promoting safety, enhancing leadership, and providing a platform for professional growth.

Objectives of Project: To ensure the highest standard of patient care by addressing clinical challenges, promoting best practices, improving workflows, and facilitating interdisciplinary communication.

Process of Implementation:

- 1. Standardize workflows among charge nurses
 - a. Hold regular meetings to review workflow consistency, address issues, and share best practices
 - b. Reinforce every charge nurse follows the same processes for patient admissions, rounding, shift handoffs, and staff delegation
 - c. Regularly gather input from staff to identify areas of improvement and adjust workflows
- 2. Optimize Phase I & Phase II throughput to decrease OR hold potential
 - a. Establish and strictly adhere to clear clinical criteria for moving patients from Phase I to Phase II
 - b. Ensure appropriate staffing levels in the PACU per ASPAN guidelines
 - c. A fast-track process that moves patients directly to Phase II, bypassing Phase I
- 3. Improve interdepartmental communication (Anesthesia providers, PT/OT, Pharmacy, Inpatient units)
 - Stress the importance of our bedside handoff tool, request anesthesia providers to signout to PACU charge, confirm OR charge nurse signed in to Vocera daily
 - b. Established clear guidelines on when and where patients work with PT/OT
 - c. Created shadow opportunities with the Pharmacy to better understand each other's workflow
 - d. Set clear expectations on the timeframe for reasonable PACU to inpatient unit admission

Statement of Successful Practice: By providing a collaborative platform for charge nurses to share best practices, address challenges, and implement solutions, the committee plays a pivotal role in evolving the practice of perianesthesia nursing.

Implications for Advancing the Practice of Perianesthesia Nursing: As demonstrated, we have implemented practices and standards of care that not only enhance the patient experience but improve interdisciplinary communication; fostering a supportive, empowered environment for nurses. This initiative has shaped an informed and effective perianesthesia nursing workforce, where charge nurses act as advocates, creating a support system that aids nurses in navigating the demands of their roles, leading to more effective healthcare delivery.
