Pediatric Perioperative Clinical Pearls and Guidelines: An "Induction" to Anesthesia Education and Collaboration Among Pediatric Specialties

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Abstract Background Information: As the complexity and acuity of pediatric health care continues to evolve, more conditions and treatments are identified, resulting in the growth of pediatric subspeciality surgical and perioperative programs. The perioperative pediatric-focused advanced practice registered nurse (APRN) exhibits expertise through extensive care coordination, education, and anticipatory guidance while ensuring optimization of the pediatric patient undergoing surgery. The role of the pediatric-focused APRN in anesthesia preparation is essential in identifying potential risk factors in order avoid adverse anesthesia and surgical outcomes. The anesthesia-focused education and guidance provided to patients, families, and colleagues during this stressful time of uncertainty allows for collaboration, support, and advocacy. To enhance this team-based approach, the dissemination of pediatric anesthesia clinical pearls and guidelines by the pediatric-focused APRN with colleagues throughout all pediatric specialties is necessary to ensure seamless perioperative care.

Statement of Successful Practice: The pediatric-focused APRN is able to successfully provide perioperative education through a review of clinical pearls and guidelines to pediatric colleagues throughout all practice settings to ensure safe and seamless perioperative pediatric care.

Implications for Advancing the Practice of Perianesthesia Nursing: The pediatric perioperative APRN role allows for a full comprehensive review of a child's medical history and collaboration among all areas of the child's care to ensure safe surgical and anesthetic outcomes. Anesthesia-focused education and perioperative care is an area of practice that involves teamwork and communication throughout all pediatric specialties, making it a very important topic to review with pediatric colleagues.
