Neurosurgical interventions are aimed to restore function, ameliorate pain, and repair vascular blood supply or to remove malignancies, to name a few. While postoperative disposition of the neurosurgical patient varies amongst organizations, it is not

uncommon for a perianesthesia nurse to care for this patient population. The perianesthesia nurse must possess the knowledge and skills of both routine perianesthesia nursing care as well as knowledge and understanding of the complexities of the nervous system and of neurosurgical procedures in order to assess, provide care for and comprehensively evaluate the neurosurgical patient. In the event of postoperative complications, timely identification and intervention as indicated is critical to prevent permanent disability. This session reviews neurosurgical and neurointerventional procedures involving the brain and spinal column. Clinical signs and symptoms, along with management strategies, of altered level of consciousness, intracranial hypertension, hemorrhage, vasospasm, altered neurologic function and endocrinopathies are discussed.

Barriers in giving verbal handoff have caused delays in the transfer of patients to the assigned inpatient units which causes delays throughout the entire perioperative course including PACU length of stay. Our "electronic handoff (E Handoff)" process has reduced delays in transferring the patients, facilitated shorter PACU stays, and have allowed the PACU nurses to be available to admit another postoperative patient without needing more time associated with verbal handoff.


