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Evolution of ASPAN Standards

- What is a standard?
...the model or example against which we measure the quality, quantity or value of something else.

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Source of Nursing Standards

- Regulatory
 - State Board of Nursing
 - Department of Health Services
 - Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services
 - Health Insurance Portability & Accountability Act
- Administrative
 - Employer / Institution policies, procedures

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Source of Nursing Standards

- Voluntary Examples
 - The Joint Commission
 - Accreditation Association for Ambulatory Healthcare
 - Nursing organizations such as the ANA

ASPAN "has the responsibility for defining the principles of safe, quality nursing practice in the perianesthesia setting".

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History



- American Society of Post Anesthesia Nurses founded in 1980
 - Promote and support core mission
 - Postanesthesia education, clinical practice & research
- First chairperson for Guidelines was Margaret Bailey (Maine)
- State leadership identified urgent need for consistent national standards for "recovery room" nurses
- Founding directors gathered to form a specialty nursing organization
- Determined establishing national standards was first strategic initiative

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Changes through the years ...

- 1989 - Standards no longer "endorsed" by the ASA
- 1992 - Standards designed and organized using a structure, process and outcome framework
 - Reflected mission, value and inter-relationships affecting perianesthesia nursing practice and patient care
 - Adopted oxygen saturation
- Mid 90's - "on call" became concern regarding patient safety
 - Change in staffing ratios Phase I and Phase II
- 1995 renamed *Standards of PeriAnesthesia Nursing Practice*
 - Initiated organization's name change to the American Society of PeriAnesthesia nurses

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Since 1995

- Environment of care continued to expand
- Competency-based practice model introduced
- Reached broader membership reaching out to nurses in all phases of care
- Scope of practice defined for preadmission and day of surgery
- Standards expanded to include assessment and management criteria for preanesthesia nurses
- Phase III standards developed
- ICU Overflow
- Fast Tracking



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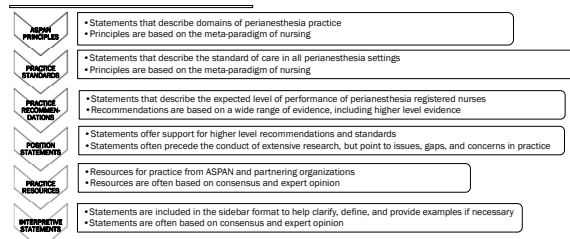
2000 – Present Day

- 2000 – Standards restructured to add clarity, eliminated redundancy
- Further defined perianesthesia nursing practice
- Guideline developed for Competent Support Staff
- Competencies developed for all phases of perianesthesia care
- Levels of care
- ACLS or PALS
- Evidence-based practice
- Changing horizon



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Even more present day.



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Goals for Standards

- All practice recommendations will contain leveled evidence
 - Continue collaboration with EBP SWT, Clinical Practice Committee, Research Committee
- Continued trends from the Clinical Practice Committee influence content in each issue of the Standards
- Continued trends from research and evidence-based practice influence content in each issue of the Standards
- Utilized by **all** bedside perianesthesia RNs
- Provide framework for evidence-based, safe, perianesthesia patient care



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How Standards are Built

- Positions Statements
 - May be brought forward by members or ASPAN board sees a need
- Practice Recommendations
 - Developed using EBP and Research
 - May come from a position statement
- Standards
 - Synthesis of all we do
 - Based on PR and PS



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Developing a New Principle or Standard

- Family-Centered Care (**NEW** Standard) - **RESOLUTION**
 - PR Family Presence Elevated?
- Perianesthesia Nursing Practice (**NEW** Principle) - **RESOLUTION**
 - Developing a new Standard or Principle
 - Search the literature
 - Critically review Position Statements and Practice Recommendations for inclusion
 - Should any Position Statements or Practice Recommendations be elevated?
 - Great opportunity to define our practice



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Developing a New Position Statement

- May be written in support of issues, gaps, and concerns in practice
 - DNR
 - Continues to be a concern
 - Automatic suspension when in the OR???
 - Concern/issue
 - Contemporary issues currently impacting perianesthesia practice
 - Substance misuse
 - Gun violence
 - Suicide/mental health
 - **NEW** - A Position Statement on Contemporary Social Issues - **RESOLUTION**

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Developing and updating Practice Recommendations

- Review of clinical trends/concerns from Clinical Practice Inquiries
- Determine the “burning question” for new practice concerns
 - a. Complete systematic review
 - b. Utilization of JBI tools for literature critique and leveling
 - c. Create synthesis table
 - d. Revise or develop Practice Recommendation from the evidence

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Expectations for Teams

Questions to ask when reviewing your sections:

1. Is the terminology current?
2. Do certain terms or phrases need clarification?
3. Is this a section of the standards that we receive a lot of questions on through CPC? And therefore, need additional clarification?
4. Are the references more than 5 years old? If so, look for updates, replace them in the document and renumber the references.
5. Does this section still need to be in the Standards, particularly when you look at the position statements?
6. Team Leads will perform a literature review driven by the search terms provided within this document. Determine if there is any new evidence/evidence-based practice so that best practices can be critiqued/leveled with supporting literature and updated or included in our Standards.
7. Is there something new we should be adding to the Standards?
8. Is there Pediatric or Older Adult information that should be provided in the Interpretive Statements?
9. **Reminder** - the standards are UNIVERSAL - you may do things differently where YOU work. Our Standards need to be relevant for a rural hospital, a critical care access institution, or a free-standing surgery center.

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Practice Recommendation

- Promotion of Normothermia in the Adult Patient
 - In the adult perianesthesia/perioperative patient, how does maintaining normothermia (normal temperature) compared to hypothermia (non-therapeutic) affect LOS, time to discharge, pain control, infection, kidney function, shivering, cardiovascular incidence, or hypoxia?
- Example of the “PICO question” when this PR developed.
- Librarian provided the PICO question.

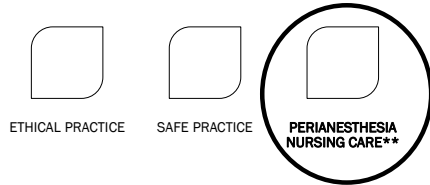

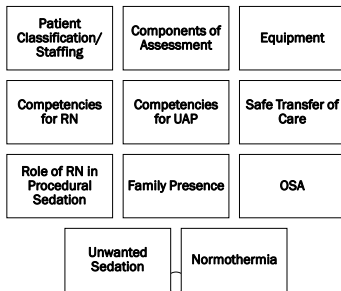

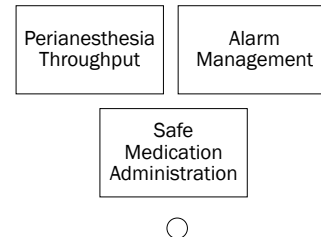
