ASPAN's Practice Recommendation 1 Patient Classification/ Staffing Recommendation is based on expert opinion. Laidlaw v. Key pathophysiologic concerns of aging combined with significant health comorbidities place the older adult at greater risk for increased mortality. Finally, rapid hemorrhage control, inflammatory cascade activation, permissive hypotension, therapeutic trauma resuscitation, damage control surgery, innovative diagnostic techniques, and best practice evidence-based trauma nursing protocols that lead to better survival outcomes will be discussed.

Intranasal esketamine (IE), derived from the anesthetic ketamine, was approved for the treatment of treatment resistant depression (TRD) and major depressive disorder (MDD) with and without suicide ideation (SI) in 2019. Based on postanesthesia expertise, perioperative care collaborated with anesthesia and behavioral health to develop a treatment service to support the treatment and monitoring needs for IE administration and increase access to care for TRD/MDD/SI patients. This intranasal esketamine service has provided a reduction in depressive symptoms and a return to functional quality of living for patients with minimal impact on the daily function of perioperative and operating room throughput.
