Medication safety to prevent error remains front and center to optimize the patient's perioperative course and outcomes. Today, when we have procedures and technologies to assist in correct identification and administration of a medication to the intended patient, errors remain in a healthcare system under pressure. Evidence-based team practice is grounded in a commitment to report and examine errors and near misses in a blame-free culture to identify emerging risks, improve existing systems, and continue to measure outcomes for new improvements.
