



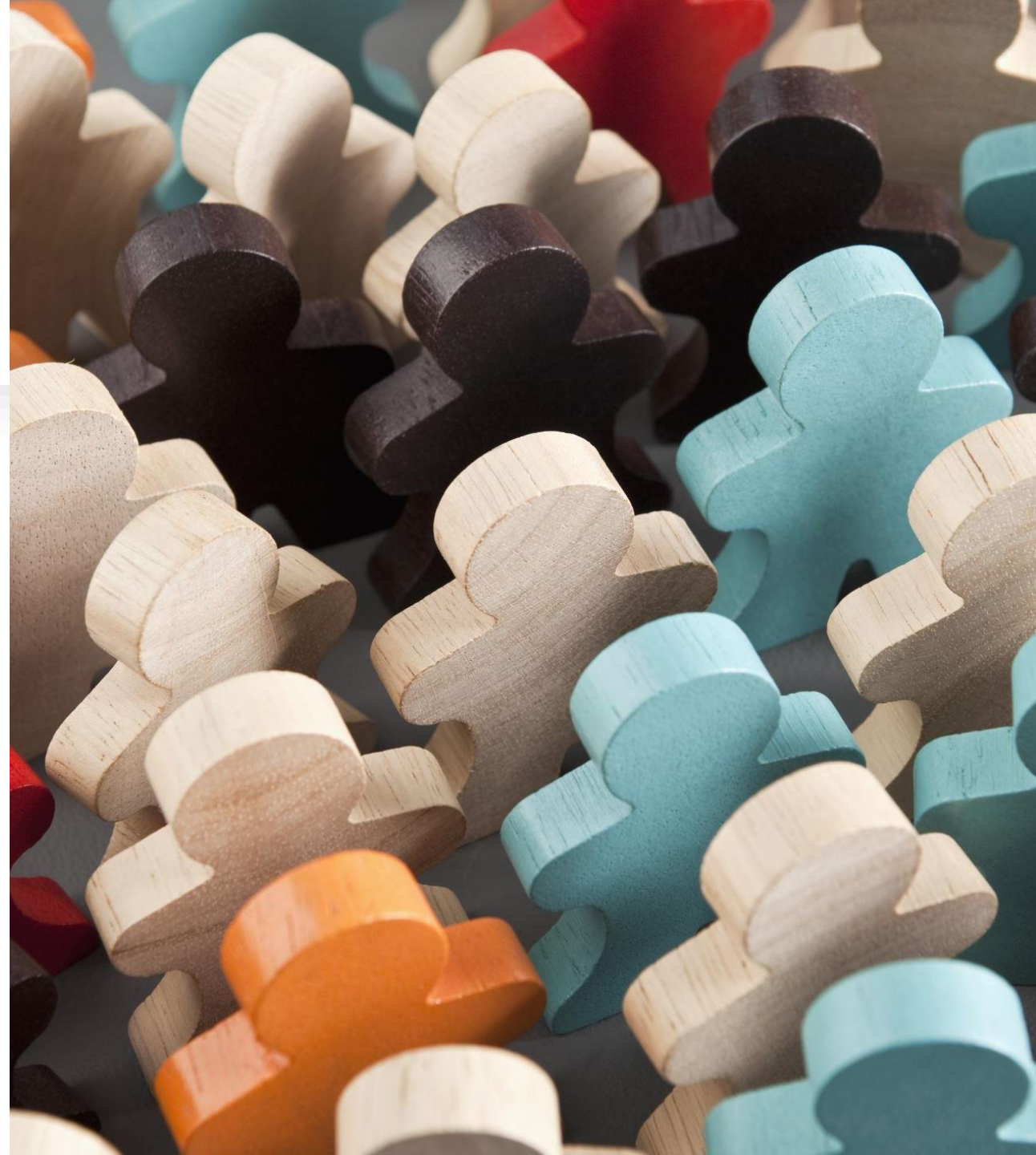

In The Beginning

- Talks began in a London Pub after the 2008 BARNA (British Anesthetic & Recovery Nurses Association) Conference
- In April 2009 a steering committee was formed and ICPAN was born



A Council Comes Together

- 2009 – Steering Committee is formed, and first convention is planned
- Countries joining in this effort were United States, United Kingdom, Canada, Ireland, Australia and Denmark
- The first conference was in 2011 hosted by Canada's NAPANc (National Association of Perianesthesia Nurses – Canada)
