

Strategies for Promoting and Increasing Certification Among Perianesthesia Nurses

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Introduction

Health consumers are more knowledgeable about the safety and quality of health care. They want expert nursing and medical care. Certification shows that nurses possess advanced nursing knowledge, expertise, and competence in their specialty field of practice.

ASPAN supports specialty certification as a strategy to ensure continuing clinical knowledge and skills as a means to deliver quality and safe patient care.

Problem

The benefits of professional nursing certification have been widely supported.

There is a recognized need to identify and address the barriers and strategies to promote specialty certification amongst Perianesthesia nurses in the Crane Surgical Suite at Mercy Medical Center (MMC).

Evidence

A literature review was completed using CINAHL and PubMed research databases.

Keywords used: nursing certification, values of certification, barriers to certification, patient outcomes


Search results yielded a total of 72 articles, 26 articles were deemed relevant.

Strength, Quality & Synthesis of Evidence

16 articles were appraised using the Johns Hopkins Nursing Evidence-Based Research Appraisal Tool.


Evidence showed that healthcare organizations that support specialty certification in nursing can have a direct impact on desire, success, and overall outcome.


Methodology

A mixed dichotomous question & Likert-style survey tool was utilized to collect quantitative data pre & post-intervention

Pre & Post Survey Results

Significance of Findings

The "Certification Station" was developed to

Percentage of staff aware of perianesthesia nursing

(CAPA/CPAN) certification increased by 60%

The likelihood of getting certified significantly

increased from 20% to 85%.

- Staff education/information on CAPA & CPAN certification including exam blueprint, registration & examination windows, eligibility requirements, and a step-by-step guide with forms for material
- Easy access to a dedicated workspace with a computer • Exam prep materials i.e., notebooks, pens, ASPANrecommended review books, PowerPoints, and QR

codes for on-demand review courses & upcoming inperson sessions Certification "champions", mentors and the voucher program with test assurance were

implemented with the certification station. Dedicated review time was another strategy implemented as a result of leadership buy-in.

Pre-intervention survey was congruent with what the literature reported

From here, nursing leadership buy-in was expanded resulting in

the purchase of exam vouchers with test assurance.



The total number of certified nurses increased from 28% to 50%



Number of certified Perianesthesia nurses increased from 6% to 22%

By the end of 2025, the goal is to have 75% of eligible nurses CPAN or CAPA certified in Crane Preop/PACU.

Implications for Perianesthesia Nurses

Providing meaningful resources & removing barriers to certification increases the likelihood of nurses to prepare and take the exam.

Organizations must facilitate & support their nurses' journey toward certification.

Perianesthesia units seeking to increase certification rates could implement similar strategies to increase the likelihood of success.
