

Nursing M&M in the Post Anesthesia Care Unit

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Background:

Morbidity and Mortality (M&M)
meetings, or clinical review
meetings, play a vital role in
improving patient care by
identifying systems and processes
that require improvement. These
meetings encourage an open,
supportive environment that
facilitates discussion, learning,
and growth among healthcare
professionals.

Local Problem:

In our high-acuity, fast-paced PACU, there are missed opportunities for learning and growth. There was no structured process in place for nursing staff to review cases, identify areas for improvement, or discuss complications, errors, and successful interventions. As a result, staff members were left feeling uncertain and concerned about the outcomes, highlighting


the need for change.


Methods/Approach:


Using a similar approach as physician M&M's and a template based on NCPS and IHI guidelines for RCA2, these meetings provide strong action items for change while creating a safe blame free environment. A pre-survey was distributed to all PACU nurses to collect baseline data, followed by a post-survey after each meeting. The surveys included Likert scales, yes/no questions, and openended questions.

Outcomes/Results:

Nurses strongly believe that Nurse
M&M meetings positively impact
both their practice and unit
performance. Over 90% of
participants reported improved
practice and PACU operations, with
enhanced teamwork, communication
with care teams, and patient care and
safety. The meetings foster a safe
environment for sharing concerns,
and all participants agreed on this. Of
18 action items identified, 61.1%
were completed, 11.1% are in
progress, and 27.7% require followup.

Conclusion:

This project demonstrated that nursing M&M increase awareness of practice standard, educating, and empowering nurses in quality improvement, and encourage collaboration with care teams. These meetings promote transparency, encourage nurses to speak up, and facilitate discussions aimed at improving patient care.
