Some programs have been updated and new programs are in development for release this year. The speaker development program has been very successful. I salute each of the speaker development participants who presented a topic in Grapevine, not only to the 40 limited attendees as advertised, but to the over 300 people who attended some sessions! My hat goes off to you, and to ASPAN Meeting Manager Courtney Papp, CMP, who facilitated last minute meeting room changes to accommodate the demand for more

Our Education Approver Committee, led by Barbara Hannah, EdD, MS, RN, CPAN, has reviewed and approved a total of 75 applications for contact hours over the past year. Beginning in July 2008, all contact hour applications must be submitted via electronic transmission to the ASPAN National Office. The application manual, and all required materials for submission, are available on the ASPAN Web site ([www.aspan.org](http://www.aspan.org)). The Education Provider and Education Approver Committees underwent a review by the American Nurses Credentialing Center-Certification on Accreditation (ANCC-COA) in late May. ASPAN now awaits the results of the re-accreditation review.

### Best Practice

The Clinical Practice Committee continues to grow and will embark on a new team process this year. Led for the past two years by newly elected ASPAN Vice-President/President-Elect Terry Clifford, MSN, RN, CPAN, this committee fielded 1719 questions from February 2007 to January 2008! Terry and her committee did a remarkable job managing and responding to the high demand for questions to be answered. The Celebrate Successful Practices program featured 58 wonderful posters at National Conference, with the

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authors present to discuss the featured findings. This was an added networking and educational opportunity for our attendees.

This year, ASPAN will strive to include more members in the clinical query answering process. Incoming Director for Clinical Practice, Barbara Godden, MHS, RN, CPAN, CAPA, will be implementing a new team process for answering these questions. Prior to being elected to this position, Barb chaired the Standards & Guidelines Committee. The revised 2008-2010 *Standards of Perianesthesia Nursing Practice*, approved by the Representative Assembly (RA) in May, will become available for purchase later this year.

### Expanding Research

Our research team has had a productive year through the directorship of Jacqueline Ross, MSN, RN, CPAN. A successful new workshop was developed and conducted to assist nurses in the design of a research study. This event focused on providing consultation for research question and methodology development. This year, ten research posters were displayed with the respective investigators present to discuss the study findings during poster grand rounds.

ASPAN supports members by providing a research grants program. If you are in the process of research, do consider applying for an ASPAN grant. In addition, a limited number of nurses are selected each year to participate in both the Education and Research Speaker Development Programs. Our scholarship program supports continuing education and certification efforts, attendance at National Conference and the Nurse in Washington Internship program. Seventeen scholarships were awarded to ASPAN members this past year.

Our mission teams and committees have been busy and will continue to keep active this year. Who would have thought when ASPAN's legacy began in the early 1980s, that we would have such productivity and capability? 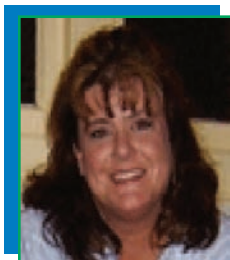

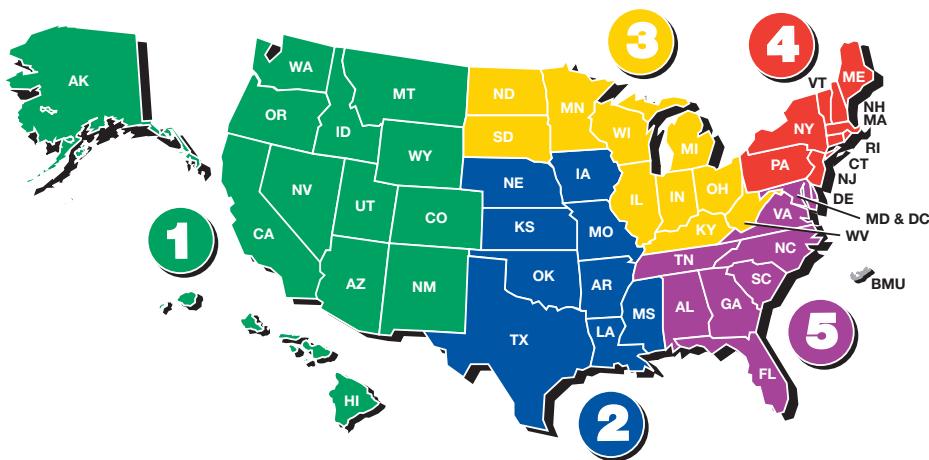

# 2009 NATIONAL CONFERENCE ABSTRACTS

Call for  
Submissions

ASPAN's 28th National Conference in Washington, D.C. will feature abstracts/posters displayed in two categories: the Celebrate Successful Practice category and the Research category. There are very specific guidelines and requirements for each grouping. It is the members' responsibility to select the appropriate category and to meet the appropriate calendar deadline for submission.

## 2009 Research Abstracts


The ASPAN Research Committee provides active perianesthesia nurses with an opportunity to present previously completed, unreported, original research findings from studies pertaining to all phases of perianesthesia nursing. A choice of oral and/or poster format may be selected for the 2009 National Conference presentations. Oral papers will be presented on Tuesday, April 21st during the "Oral Research Presentations" afternoon session. Poster displays will occur on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday of Conference week, with poster grand rounds scheduled on Tuesday. Poster presenters are requested to be in attendance on these days.

A copy of the Institutional Review Board approval letter must be submitted; the evidence based practice format may not require such approval. Those submitting oral and poster abstracts are given the opportunity to have their abstracts published in the June issue of the *Journal of PeriAnesthesia Nursing (JoPAN)*. These may be helpful for abstract development. Other helpful resources are available in the Research section of ASPAN's Web site.

If you are interested in presenting research findings, please submit an application for anonymous peer review. Acceptance of abstracts is based on scientific merit and strict adherence to submission guidelines. All project contributors receive an award certificate. The Research Committee thanks you in advance for your interest, participation and support of perianesthesia research.

- If interested in presenting research findings at the 28th National Conference in Washington, D.C., please carefully follow the guidelines for abstract submission
- Complete and submit the ASPAN Research Abstract Submission Form
- **Application for Oral Paper Presentation and Poster Display Presentation MUST be postmarked by November 1, 2008.** Any applications received postmarked after this date are returned and not reviewed
- Applicants will receive notification from the reviewers by January 8, 2009

## 2009 Celebrate Successful Practices

Celebrate Successful Practices (CSP) is your opportunity to present and share great ideas found to be successful in practice. This program offers an avenue for members to present an issue and discuss a successful implementation plan related to improved patient care, nurse satisfaction, leadership strategies, and patient safety. These are just some ideas to start you thinking. Submissions may be derived from any successful practice related to perianesthesia nursing.

The CSP program introduces a **NEW FORMAT** this year. Abstracts will undergo an anonymous peer review process. A team of reviewers will examine the abstract for specific criteria. If your abstract is accepted, you will be assigned to **EITHER** a poster presentation, **OR** invited to participate in a CSP PowerPoint® presentation/discussion session. In the latter format, you will join three colleagues. Each participant will deliver a ten-minute presentation followed by several minutes of audience questions/discussion. Please consider submitting your successful practice for review!

### Important CSP information and dates:

- There are specific guidelines regarding abstract format and content
- Identified project leaders must be ASPAN members
- **Applications MUST be postmarked by November 1, 2008 deadline to be considered.** Any applications received postmarked after this date are returned and not reviewed
- Applicants are notified of acceptance to either a poster session or an oral presentation by January 8, 2009

ASPAN conducted the following official business during National Conference.

### ACTIVITY UPDATES

#### REGIONAL DIRECTORS' REPORT

ASPAN remains committed to component growth and development. Each component has been working closely with its respective Regional Director, and many commonalities across the regions have been identified. Ongoing efforts will be directed toward leadership, succession planning, communication, Web site development, and fiscal responsibility. Regional directors will be available to meet with component representatives during the Salt Lake City Component Development Institute in September.

#### ASPAN EDUCATION APPROVER PROGRAM

The American Nurses Credentialing Center (ANCC) has become more stringent in its contact hour application guidelines. It is the goal of ASPAN's Education Approver Committee to assist components in successfully completing their contact hour applications. A seminar was offered at the

National Conference to provide attendees with the tools and specific terminology to correctly complete an application.

#### PERIANESTHESIA DATA ELEMENTS (PDE) COMMITTEE

It is anticipated that a CD-ROM and printed manual will be available at next year's National Conference. This resource will include practical information and instructions for application of the PDE in the perianesthesia setting.

#### COUNCIL FOR SURGICAL AND PERIOPERATIVE SAFETY (CSPS)

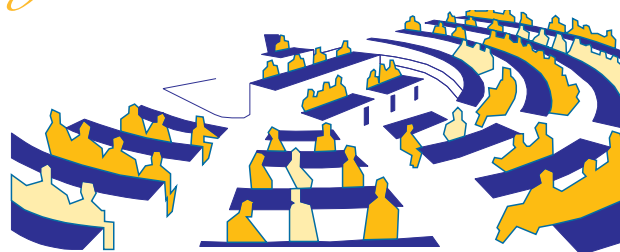
ASPAN was represented at the 2008 CSPS meeting and assisted in the development of the Council's mission and core values.

#### ENDORSEMENT OF LEGISLATIVE BILLS

An ad hoc committee has been formed to investigate a process for ASPAN to apply when considering the endorsement of legislative bills.

#### RESEARCH WORKSHOP

Thirteen novice researchers attended a foundational workshop in Grapevine. The participants will be mentored throughout the




year as they develop specific research projects. It is anticipated that this workshop will again be offered in 2009.

### REPRESENTATIVE ASSEMBLY HIGHLIGHTS

The Representative Assembly approved the following resolutions:

- Resolution 2008-2: A Position Statement on the Geriatric Patient
- Resolution 2008-3: A Position Statement on Advocacy
- Resolution 2008-4: *The 2008-2010 Standards of Perianesthesia Nursing Practice*

Presentations given during the Assembly included updates from the Evidence Based Practice Committee, Web Site Redesign Strategic Work Team (SWT), and Staffing SWT. The ASPAN Membership Survey results were reported, as was information on the Office of the National Nurse initiative.

## Distinguished Service Award of the Past Presidents' Council

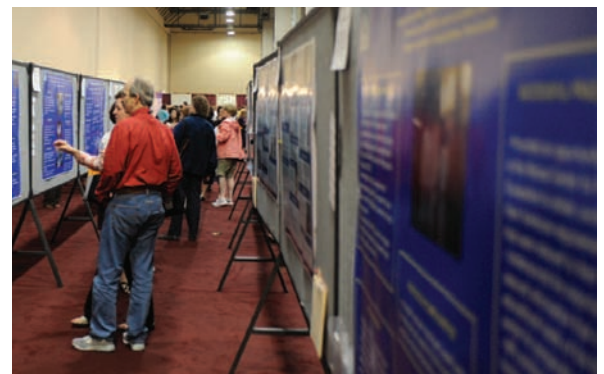

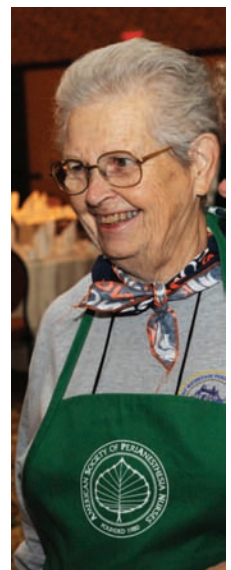

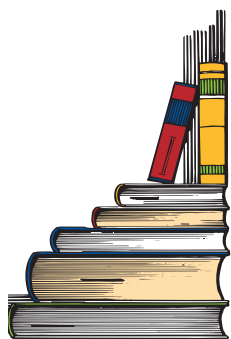
